Though this is a statement of absolute truth from Mr. Spurgeon, there are other equally true facts about December 25th.

Those who do not know Jewish, Church, or Biblical history want to teach that December 25th was chosen as the date of Jesus' birth because it was already a pagan holiday. The reasoning is that Christians wanted to reach the lost souls around them and sought to combine the birth of Christ with the worldly festivals.

The oldest Bible commentary known to exist is from a man named Hippolytus of Rome and is on the book of Daniel. The commentary was written around 170 years after Christ ascended back to heaven.

In this commentary, Hippolytus calculated the date of Jesus' birth by tracing history backwards to Caesar Augustus. It is the earliest known mention of the date of Christ's birth, and Hippolytus set the date as December 25th. The date had and has nothing to do with pagan festivals.

Like a lot of things, the Catholic Church wants credit for the date. They claim that Pope Julius I official named December 25 as the date of Jesus' birth based on the writing of Roman Emperor Constantine in 336AD. This event took place nearly 140 years after the death of Hippolytus.

It is also widely circulated that December 25th was the date of the festival Saturnalia, named for the Roman god Saturn. The festival corresponded with the winter solstice. That festival was started nearly 100 years after Hippolytus died, so Christians did not choose that date to reach the lost.

Does any of this matter as we prepare to celebrate Christmas on December 25? Well that depends. Are we celebrating being together with family, giving presents, singing carols, shopping, parties, etc. all? Or are we celebrating the birth of the Christ?


If it is the latter, then the date doesn't really matter all that much. No one in the Bible mentions the date. Mark and John don't even mention the
