Work of a Evangelist! We believe that this calling is a gift from God, but we also believe that according to Jesus words in Matthew 28:18-20 it is a command given to us to go and to make disciples of all nations. This brings challenges. We work hard and we pray that God will lead us and gives us effective spiritual conversations with people we meet. It is a challenge to teach a young believer to perform the work of an evangelist when he sees no fruit.

Please pray for the young believers and the young workers who daily share their faith but have not yet seen any fruit.

Pray for them to stay motivated and strong in God's spirit and to expect fruit in His time.

In contribution to this, our ministry in Macedonia sends a team of 5 students and 3 staff on a short mission trip in Kragujevac, small city in neighboring country Serbia. Their mission is to train the local students on how to do evangelism and to help launch a Student Spiritual Movement. The team will stay in Kragujevac for 5 days from February 15th to 20th.

At the same time the students volunteers and the staff in Macedonia are continuing with everyday evangelism that takes place at faculties and student dorms in Skopje and other cities. **Please pray** that the Holy Spirit will lead us with power and wisdom as we testify.

This is a long preparation so **please pray** for Visa from the US Embassy for me, Adelina and the new baby. Gabi, Luka, and Philip already have visas from the previous time when we were in the states in 2016.

You are in our hearts and prayers and we always remember the days when we visited you. We pray that your faithfulness, love and support for us will be rewarded with God's blessings.
