We must not forget God's sacrificial love for us sinners who live in this sinful world without the knowledge of tomorrow, but only the hope that God is in complete control. We must always remember what in fact God did for us. Apostle Paul reminds us in

**Philippians 2: 5-8** *"In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death—even death on a cross!"* 

Such great sacrifice, humility and devotion we can only see in pure love, and that is our God who accepted us unconditionally. It is up to us to be grateful and to rejoice. And Peter reminds us why we should rejoice and give thanks.

**1Peter 1: 3-6** "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. This inheritance is kept in heaven for you, who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of

the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time. In all this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials"

Only God knows how grateful we are and we ask our Heavenly Father to bless your generous heart according to His mercy and grace.
