Georgia State University—at Clarkston—which is the most diverse city in the USA with many refugees.



Our team got to meet up at GSU-Clarkston with some old friends from Newark, Ohio: Armin & Colleen McMahan. They moved as missionaries to "reach the nations" from Clarkston, Georgia. This from Wikipedia, "At present, students attending Clarkston High School come from over 50 countries; and over half the population is estimated by some to be foreign born."

Georgia State University is smack dab in the middle of all this, so we thought it would be strategic for reaching the nations to

build a student movement there. We started by meeting the local Cru staff who want to help, and we passed out flyers and had spiritual conversations with students who were interested. Then we gathered with pastors and the McMahans and prayer-walked all around campus. Lastly, Ronnie met with a student leader named Hannah and shared vision and ideas of how to get things going. Hannah is faithfully working but things haven't worked out yet. Please pray she would be able to get a faculty advisor. And please pray for Gladys, the local Cru staff lady who is herself a prayer warrior. She is also coming once a week to do evangelism.

As we were leaving, everyone told us to stop at Refugee Coffee Co., a coffee truck, to get a great coffee to support this ministry which gives jobs and training to refugees. I got a "Chagachinno!" Why not, where else am I going to find one? It's ingredients were, "Chaga [mushrooms], cacao, cinnamon, vanilla, monk fruit sweetener, and milk." Tasted like chicken. Just kidding, it was a pretty good coffee. Chaga growing on a tree looks pretty gross...if I'd only known. And I quote, "It resembles a dark clump of dirt more than a



mushroom, but is distinguished from other growths by its orange tissue." Who knew it'd be a superfood? According to MedicalNewsToday Chaga "slows aging, lowers cholesterol, fights cancer, lowers BP, supports immunity, fights inflammation, lowers blood sugar, and prevents drug side effects." I may live until Jesus returns because of this one coffee, but I digress.

Looking Ahead

Amy and I were asked to coach **Western Carolina University**, which is in NC, near Tennessee. So we are traveling there **October 25-28** and have already been meeting with a group of 7 student leaders via Zoom. These leaders are amazing in the fact that the common reason why they all want to help start Cru is to do outreach and reach the campus. Our colleague, Stefan, found all but one of these leaders through an Instagram strategy that he has nearly perfected. He'll meet us there and for 3 days we'll train the leaders and plan and kickoff their 1st Cru meeting. We'll survey students one day and then contact them for follow-up the next day, modeling to the leaders how to share

the gospel with students. Please pray for us and the student leaders: Josh, Corton, Blake, Ella, Lauren, Autumn, and Brooklyn.

Amy and I continue to coach student leaders at **Monmouth, Lake Erie, South West Michigan, and Albion colleges.** I am discipling two guys at Lake Erie College, pictured at right. Trey is a key leader there, leading the Bible studies each week as a junior. He has a big heart for God and the lost. Jarrod is also helping lead Cru at Lake Erie. He's well connected and serves so many places on campus. He is growing in his faith and leading Lake Erie students to the Cleveland Area Cru Fall Retreat, **Nov 12-13,** which will be a



great opportunity for all who attend to grow closer to God, gain vision to reach their campus, and connect with other Christian students. Please pray for these two guys to consistently walk with the Lord and reach out to others, and my ability to connect with and challenge them.
