Babe Ruth. the Home Run king.


The Yankee in our opening story holds the record for least strike-outs in a major league career. Babe Ruth holds the record for the most strike-outs.

FAMILY FEUD "And the Survey Says..."



Hello friends and partners,

It has been a long time since the last update. Yes, we have started the New Year and winter weather is here in Columbus, Ohio. As I type this, we are amid a bit of an ice storm here where we live.

Outreach/Upcoming Event -- The good news is we have been able to do our tabling inside the Ohio Union here at The Ohio State University. Here are some recent pictures of our students helping with the tabling. As you can see, we are also promoting our upcoming event "I Don't Have Enough Faith To Be An Atheist" on March 8th We have had Dr. Frank Turek (Cross Examined. Org), come to campus several times and we think this is one of the best presentations to get people thinking about our worldview. Frank speaks on campuses every week and has dealt with hundreds of questions. He is a gifted communicator.

Can you pray for a good turnout and that there will be tons of interest in this event? This is our first large event since Covid came into our world. The event is free and open to the public. If you are coming, invite a friend. It is a great opportunity for outreach. The God question impacts every area of reality, and this is an opportunity for students to hear some truth.
