Shiloh Military Ministries has 11 missionary teams who are located near various military bases to provide Bible-based teaching, hospitality and activities for service members to grow in Christ.

The team we are supporting is Larry and Linda Ingalls, who are serving the base at Fort Riley in Kansas, Susie and Tom first heard of this mission back in May 2022 when the Ingalls were visiting Johnstown Independent Baptist Church. JIBC also supports this mission team and Larry was there with his wife and daughter to give a ministry update. Susie was really moved by their story and their generous hospitality and the passion that Larry had for God and for bringing the message of good news to military personnel and their families.

In 1977, as a young marine, Larry was led to Christ in part through ministries and missionaries reaching military servicemen stationed overseas. As a result of their mentoring him in the Christian faith, and the Word of God, Larry gained a passion to do this very work as well. In 1979 as a student at Biola University, Linda also decided to devote her life to service in missions. Larry and Linda met at their church in Southern California and married in 1983. The Ingalls began their missionary work with Cadence International as hospitality house directors in 1985, first serving the Army and Air Force stationed in Panama.

After additional education at the Moody Bible Institute, the Ingalls moved in 1994 to Yokosuka, Japan, where they directed The Lighthouse hospitality house, serving sailors stationed there in the Navy's 7th Fleet. And in 2009 the Ingalls relocated to Fort Riley, Kansas to open the Rivendell House where they remain today serving our Soldiers in the Army's 1st Infantry Division.

In 2021 the Ingalls transitioned to serve under Shiloh Military Ministries. Their focus and ministry at Fort Riley continues the same. Larry's passion is teaching the inerrant, inspired, authoritative Word of God and mentoring men in the Christian faith. Linda's joy is serving others with her gift of hospitality, and to encourage and mentor younger women. Larry and Linda have three children and two grandchildren.

Men and women in the military have a unique set of needs. Sometimes they are far from home...away from family and friends. They can move around, making it hard to sit down roots, not to mention that they could be deployed at any time. The modern military like so many work places and institutions, also has some challenges that arise from policies that are not in line with the Christian faith. So isolation, uncertainty, family logistics, and challenges to hearing the faith and walking in the faith makes this a very special mission.

In order to meet these needs this couple literally opens their home to the people they serve on a constant basis. They call their home Rivendell House. At Rivendell House, Larry, and Linda Ingalls provide a Christ- centered "home-away-from-home" for our Soldiers stationed at Fort Riley, Kansas. Through pastoral mentorship and the teaching of the Word of God, we share the Christian message of Jesus Christ and his salvation for all who will believe. During our weekly gatherings for meals or Bible studies or recreation together, our home is a Christian haven (a Rivendell) for rest, for spiritual renewal and growth, for mentoring, and for redemptive friendships.

There is not enough space here to share all the ways we were ministered to by the Ingalls family.

And when Susie contacted Larry recently, he asked us to pray for recent baptisms last month of two female soldiers, Eva and Yadi, who recently came to saving faith. Angi and Mac, two of our soldiers, who both got saved in the past three years, and who also met here at Rivendell House, and are now husband and wife. And just last night, another of our soldiers, Jared, Led a fellow soldier, Ori, to faith in Christ after our evening Bible study. Ori has been coming to Bible studies with Jared for about a month now and it all spiritually came together for him this week. The Ingalls praise the Lord for these new Christians. Please pray for them as we now seek to follow up with them in discipleship.

As you can see, this ministry is very good for the soldiers and their families. Let's give them our support.
