Hello church family,

I grew up a tennis fanatic. Even when we went on vacation, I would stay in the hotel room watching Jimmy Connors take on John McEnroe while the rest of the family did other things.

Bjorn Borg was my favorite. He came along as Connors and Chris Evert, the darling of women's tennis, were the best in the world - and dating each other. Borg comes on the scene, the Pete Maravich of tennis. Long blond hair kept at bay by a headband around his head. drooping socks that gathered on his ankles. But something else. Absolute calm. While Connors was a grenade waiting to go off, arguing with refs, fans, and opponents alike, Borg never said a word. He just went out and won. And won. And kept on winning. He ended up winning 11 Grand Slam titles, equivalent to the Masters and US Open in golf. Connors would win 8. The most famous of the trio, John McEnroe, would win only 7.

Ivan Lendl arrived in their midst and the big three became the big four. Lendl won 8 Grand Slams too, Wimbledon, the US Open etc. All things being equal, Lendl is the best tennis has ever seen, IMHO.

Age as always took it's toll and a new breed came along. The best of them was Pete Sampras. Sampras won 14 Grand Slam titles and the tennis world thought that record would stand forever. In 2001 Pete was trying to win his 32nd consecutive

match at Wimbledon, meaning he hadn't lost there in nearly 5 years. His opponent that day was a little known 19-year-old named Roger Federer.

Federer would win that match and Sampras would retire the following year. The world didn't know it yet, but a run of unprecedented greatness had just begun. Federer would not just eclipse Sampras's Grand Slam record; he would obliterate it. Winning a then total of 20 major titles.

Roger Federer; "I won 80% of my matches. But only 54% of the points I played."

Meaning his opponents played tennis at an equal level - but Federer almost always won. Just a 4% difference between greatness and ordinary.

How was he able to do that? He had a short memory. He didn't dwell on the points he lost. He didn't let the last point have any impact on the next point. In other words - he left the past in the past.

Philippians 3:13-14 - BSB - Brothers, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize of God's heavenly calling in Christ Jesus.

Paul was still in the middle of the game. "I haven't taken hold of it (the prize) yet. But there is only one way to keep moving forward. And that is to quit looking backwards.





"We are blessed to have you as the shepherd of our congregation. Your sermons inspire us each week, and we thank you for all that you do".








October 19th following church
